

SPH 100,000 Strong in the Americas Mexico Program 2023

Mexico's National Institute of Public Health (INSP)

Several School of Public Health students will be selected to participate in a field experience during the summer of 2023 in Cuernavaca, Mexico in collaboration with [Instituto Nacional de Salud Pública \(INSP\)](#), the National Institute of Public Health of Mexico, thanks to support from the [100,000 Strong in the Americas Innovation Fund](#). This fund aims to increase student exchange and training programs between the Americas, with a focus on increasing opportunities available to students from underrepresented and/or disadvantaged backgrounds. Students will be exposed to the School of Public Health and the INSP educational, practice, and research activities. INSP is looking for creative students who are committed to community-based public health and who have an understanding of global public health.

Students must apply to the Global Health Program's 100,000 Strong in the Americas Mexico Program. Field experiences will be tailored to students' interests, qualifications, and host organization faculty match following the applicant selection process. **This field experience may be used as a student applied practice experience, subject to approval by students' academic and division practicum advisor.*

Eligibility Requirements:

The applicant must:

- Be enrolled in the MPH program at SPH
- Have completed 18 SH of the MPH curriculum by the date of travel
- Have intermediate Spanish proficiency
- Be able to commit to a **minimum** 6-week time period in summer 2023 (May – August 2023)
- Have a cumulative GPH of 3.0 or better (4.0 scale)
- Priority will be given to:
 - Students from underrepresented and/or disadvantaged backgrounds
 - Students enrolled in the Global Health Concentration
- Should s/he be selected:
 - Obtain University COVID-19 Pre-travel Unit/Dept Head Approval
 - Obtain the University of Illinois System's comprehensive insurance for international travel
 - Abide by the host organization's policies and procedures
 - Commit to making a meaningful contribution to the host organization
 - Act in an ambassadorial manner throughout the experience
 - Participate in two cultural activities and document these experiences in a two-page reflection for each site visited
 - Commit to completing three journal entries, including a post experience report
 - Conduct a presentation to the program team at UIC to report on their learning experience
 - Students are highly encouraged to submit a poster to the SPH Annual Research and Awards Day

Application:

The applicant must submit:

- Application Form
- Updated resume/CV
- A brief statement of intent (no more than two double-spaced pages) identifying why you would like to participate in the Cuernavaca field experience and qualifications you will bring. Please also include special areas of interest on which you hope to focus.
- Please briefly mention any prior international experience.
- Results from a language self-assessment tool

Timeline

- Applications are due by March 13, 2023.
- Selected applicants will be notified by April 3, 2023.
- Letter of Commitment is due by April 10, 2023.

Process

- Student indicates intent by submitting application.
- Students are expected to inform advisor of intent.
- Applicants are notified of selection outcome.
- Student, applied practice experience advisor, SPH Global Health Program, and host organization build learning objectives for experience.

Budget

Students will work with the Global Health Program to discuss budget.

Round-trip airfare and housing are kindly subsidized by the Global Health Program through the support of the 100,000 Strong in the Americas Innovation Fund. As such, students selected for the 2023 Mexico Program are not allowed to receive funding through other Global Health Program scholarships. Applicants to this program are also welcome to apply for those other scholarships but will have to choose which opportunity to accept should they be accepted by more than one.
